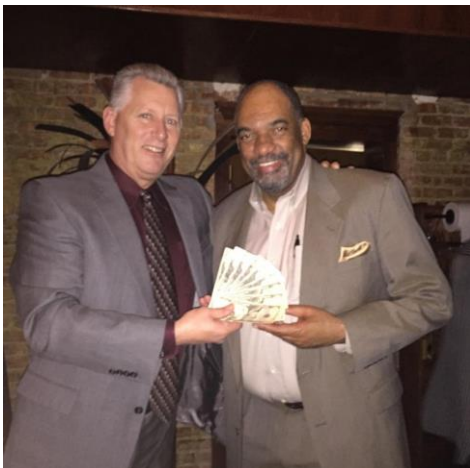

NEW MEMBERS:

There are no new members to report since our last newsletter.

FROM DICK LOCKHART:

Senate amendment #1 to SB 1260 sets forth 35 services referred to as the "Tax Modernization Act." Senator Michael Noland is the sponsor.

At this time, it does not include your services; however, it appears to be the legislation which will apply the sales tax to a range of services, the extent of which we will not know for some time.

However, SB 1260 must be on our "watch list" until adjournment.

SB 1260 (Noland - Cullerton, J.) is 185 pages and is identified as The State Budget Law. It is the most important piece of legislation now before the members of the General Assembly. It includes provisions extending the sales tax to 35 specific services. You are not on this list at this time. However, #35 is "personal property," whatever that may turn out to be?

SB 1260 is referred to as the Senate Executive Committee, the members of which are attached. As we have stated, you are not included in this bill at this time. However, this bill will be amended and we will do our best to keep you fully informed of all developments.

This will take you to the Illinois State Board of Elections website. On the top left of the screen, click Option, District/Official Search. To the right of the next screen, click "Mobile/Lite Version Search." On the next screen there is a map. At the bottom of the map, enter your address or zip code. Click "Find Address" then "OK." Click "Confirm Address." All pertinent contact information, including your various representatives, District numbers, party affiliation, addresses and phone numbers.

How can I find out the status of a piece of legislation?

Look on the left side of the home page for the Illinois General Assembly. Enter the number of the bill into the box, such as sb 90 or hb 90. Click "Go." If you don't know the number of the bill, you can also search by keyword.

There is a box on the top left side of the home page which will tell you whether or not the House or the Senate is in session. If the House or Senate is not in session, the next session date is given.

POLITICAL/LEGISLATION:

Governor Rauner also filled the seat vacated by Bryan Schneider, who the governor appointed in January to serve as secretary of the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation. Attorney William Cadigan, who is from Rauner's hometown of Winnetka, will take over for Schneider. Cadigan is active in the New Trier Republican Party organization.

Firm Profile

WILLIAM J. CADIGAN is principal in the Law Office of William J. Cadigan, P.C. located in Chicago, Illinois. Before starting his own firm, Bill Cadigan was a member of the Health Industry Group of the law firm of Akin, Gump, Strauss, Hauer & Feld L.L.P.

In his practice, Bill Cadigan represents hospitals, health systems, academic medical centers, physician practices, and health care trade associations and other tax exempt organizations in corporate, transactional and regulatory matters. In addition, Mr. Cadigan also provides counsel to businesses in a variety of industries on matters ranging from formation and general corporate matters to financings and civil litigation. Mr. Cadigan also advises elected officials, candidates, and political action committees on federal and state election law compliance issues.

Bill Cadigan formerly served as Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Chicago Technology Park, an incubator and multi-tenant facility for emerging companies in the field of biotechnology, genomics and pharmaceutical production. From 1999 to 2005, Mr. Cadigan served as a Commissioner of the Illinois Medical District. Located on Chicago's Near West Side, the Illinois Medical District includes 560 acres of hospitals, medical research facilities, universities, and over 40 healthcare related facilities.

Before entering law school, Bill Cadigan worked on Capitol Hill as an aide for Congressman John E. Porter (10th-IL), handling appropriations, health care, education and other domestic policy issues. Prior to entering private practice, Bill Cadigan served as an Assistant State's Attorney in Lake County, Illinois and as in-house counsel for Metra, the commuter rail agency for northeastern Illinois. He is

admitted to practice before the Illinois Supreme Court, the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Illinois and the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit.

Bill Cadigan is a member of the American Health Lawyers Association, the Illinois Association of Healthcare Attorneys, the American Society of Association Executives, the Chicago Bar Association, and the Lawyers Club of Chicago. He is a guest lecturer at the Loyola University Chicago School of Law Institute for Health Law and also a contributing author/editor to The Law of Medical Practice in Illinois, 3rd Edition (West Group), and Representing Physicians Handbook, 2nd Edition (American Health Lawyers Association). Bill provides pro bono services to the Legal Clinic of the Chicago Lighthouse for the Blind and is a past recipient of the Tomorrow's Leaders of the Profession award by the Illinois State Bar Association.

In addition to his law practice, Bill has been a leader in promoting causes dedicated to eliminating the culture of corruption in Illinois. Following the indictment of Blagojevich insiders in the federal investigation "Operation Board Games," Bill drafted an op/ed for the Chicago Tribune that laid out a detailed plan for reform of state boards and commissions. Many of the measures proposed were later adopted by the Illinois General Assembly and put in place by Executive Order in the wake of Blagojevich scandals. Bill's work on reform was recognized in the final report issued by the Illinois Reform Commission, an independent body empanelled to examine government practices and ethics, and make recommendations for cleaning up state government.

Bill has competed in and finished 8 marathons, and in his spare time is an avid bicyclist and reader. He received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Eastern Illinois University and a Juris Doctorate from the John Marshall Law School.

Three charged after cops bust unlicensed armed security firm

The owner and two employees of an unlicensed company that authorities claim provided armed security to liquor stores on the South and West sides, and in south suburban Harvey, have been arrested.

Investigators learned last month that Harvey Jones, 48, was making agreements to provide armed security to liquor stores in Chicago and other parts of Cook County, according to a statement from the Cook County sheriff's office. He was not licensed by the state to run a security firm.

Members of the sheriff's police and the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation visited six stores where Jones' employees were believed to work on March 12, the sheriff's office said. They arrested two Chicago men who had FOID cards but were not certified to be armed security guards.

Anthony Holloway, 42, was arrested at a liquor store in the 0-100 block of East 159th Street in Harvey. Tracy Fraley, also 42, was arrested at a liquor store in the 3900 block of West Arthington. They were each charged with unlawful use of a weapon.

A third man found working security at a store in the 800 block of West 115th Street was armed with a cap gun and was not charged, according to the sheriff's office.

Jones, of Blue Island, turned himself in on March 19 and was charged with a misdemeanor count of operating a security company without a license, the sheriff's office said.


